**Call for students selection: Double Degree with Clermont School of Business (France)
A.Y. 2025-26**

The Department of Economics and Management "Marco Fanno" (dSEA), within the framework of the partnership stipulated with ESC Clermont School of Business (France), opens a call for selection for Double degree exchange mobility program.

Selection, based on academic qualification and interview outcome, will be for the following:

1. Eligibility requirements

The admission to the exchange program is possible for those students that are enrolled at the first year in the "Management for Sustainable Firms" Master's degree at the Department of Economics and Management "Marco Fanno" for AY. 2024-25.

The exchange period is planned for the full second year.



2. Terms and conditions for submitting the application

Applications must be submitted online via the [Moodle SESP platform of the Department of Economics and Management "Marco Fanno" \(Student Area\)](#) no later than 4th December 2024, before 12:00 p.m. (local time GMT + 1).

3. Selection criteria

The selection criteria will be applied as follow:

- 30/100 study efficiency*;
- 60/100 motivational interview. Students will be considered eligible with a score greater than or equal to 35/60;
- 10/100 score to be assigned according to previous international experiences.

If one student obtains the same final score of another, we will accord the priority to the older candidate. In case more than 20 students will apply, only the 20 candidates with the upper "study efficiency" score will be admitted to the interview.

4. Interview and assessment of English language

The motivational interview will take place in English and it is mainly focus on the candidate's interest for studying at the partner Institution for the Double degree award, with particular reference to the candidate's academic track and professional aspirations.

The English language certificate is not mandatory to join the interview. However, the partner Institution may ask a certificate to the admitted students in the phase of application.

The interview will take place in early December 2024.

The International Mobility Service of the Department of Economics and Management will communicate by email the schedule of interviews on the basis of the received applications.

5. Administrative compliances for the selected students

The departure of the winners is always subject to acceptance by the partner Institution.

Extra EU students must be aware that they will have to take care of their Italian Residence permit and that a VISA (and therefore proof of finance) may be required also to travel to other European countries.



Students who will attend the Double Degree program at Clermont School of Business must continue to pay the fees at UNIPD only.

Enrolment in a dual degree course precludes simultaneous enrolment in another higher education course.

6. Scholarship

In order to define the scholarship for the Double degree program students must wait for the final budget assignment. The mentioned budget will be approved by Unipd International Relations Division.

In order to obtain the Erasmus grant, students must provide proof of evidence linked to their stay at the partner university. It is to be noted that the mentioned stay period should not be less than two months and students should obtain no less than 12 ECTS.

In order to obtain the Double Degree, students must complete all the courses and exams as described on the Department of Economics and Management's [dedicated webpage](#).

***Study efficiency**

1– First year LM students with an international qualification:

$$(\text{Score-C} - \text{Score-Min}) / (\text{Score-Max} - \text{Score-Min}) * 30$$

where: Score-C is the candidate's admission score, Score-Min and Score-Max are respectively the lowest and highest admission score recorded among all candidates

2– First year LM students graduated in Italy:

$$(\text{Grade-C} - \text{Grade-Min}) / (\text{Grade-Max} - \text{Grade-Min}) * 30$$

where: Grade-C is the degree mark obtained in the course of study considered for the candidate's admission, Grade-Min and Grade-Max are respectively the lowest and highest degree marks recorded among all candidates. A grade of 110 cum laude is counted as 111.
